- After every mock, identify wrong answers, conceptual gaps, time-consuming questions, questions you should have skipped, and topics needing more practice.

- Do more than solve them: analyze why the question works and revisit questions you struggled with.

7. Strengthen Your Weakest Section

8. Maintain an Error Log

9. Practice Under Exam-Like Conditions

- Use timed sectional tests and full-length mocks without distractions.
- Follow the same time limits and delay solution-checking until the test is complete.

10. Stay Consistent With Revision and Practice
